Larry "Zeezo" Campbell came to the stage and started out with his famous color changing knives trick. He ends by putting a pocket knife into a volunteer's


hand, and the pocket knife turns out to be Larry's business card.


Larry brought up a young volunteer and did the "Two coin" trick. Coins go into his hand, and into his pocket, but always there are two coins...



## The Power of Video!

It was plain for me to see that I specifically looked in a place I should not have and may have spoiled a surprise for the audience.

I would never have known this had it not been for the video. Remembering the old magician idea that they will look where you look, I now know that I need to practice and rehearse not putting my eyes on the dirty work at one specific point in my routine.

What can you gain from recording yourself, or even practicing in front of a mirror? Perhaps there is much to see and learn, and that fits in well with our goal of improving magic this year.

#### Sponge ball Workshop

The pre-meeting workshop featured the world famous Joyce Basch teaching her exciting sponge ball routine. Joyce, who is also known as Ms. Gician, has traveled around the world doing magic, and has performed on all seven continents.

The routine Joyce taught was based on a simple "count to ten" system. Each number is a different move in the sequence, and of course the routine ends with multiple sponge balls in the spectator's hand.

The workshop was well attended and well enjoyed by all.

## Practicing vs. Rehearsing by Jon Strum



Among magicians, the terms "practice" and "rehearsal" are often used interchangeably, yet they represent distinct stages in the development of a magical performance. And understanding the difference between these two concepts is crucial to transforming even the simplest trick into a memorable, magical moment that captures the imagination of an audience.

Practice is the ongoing process in which a magician learns and refines the basic skills and techniques required to perform a specific trick. Practice is a solitary activity focused on mastering the fundamental elements of magic, like sleight of hand or learning the mechanics of a new stage illusion. Magicians spend hours practicing these basic skills, developing the muscle memory that ensures they can perform them flawlessly and without thought.

For example, a magician learning a card trick will practice shuffling, cutting, and controlling cards. They'll repeat these actions

thousands of times until they can perform them unconsciously. Practice is about the self-discipline that ultimately leads to truly magical performance.

Rehearsal is about taking the skills honed during practice and integrating them into a complete, polished performance. Rehearsal involves working out timing, scripting, and overall flow of a trick. Rehearsal is the point in the development of a trick when misdirection and audience management are added. Rehearsal includes applying stage craft (to stage, parlor, and close-up performances) and making the necessary choices that will create the best possible audience experience. Whether a magician is performing for an audience of one or one thousand; whether that magician is on stage, standing in a living room, sitting at a table, or holding court in the break room at work, spectators will look where the magician looks. When does the magician focus their gaze to the right? When do they look to the left? Where are their hands? When does a magician lean forward at the table?

When do they cross the stage? When do they make direct eye contact and call a spectator by name, forcing them to look up? Each of these simple, subtle actions will have a major impact on the quality of a magical performance. The magician who chooses to ignore making these choices during rehearsal and, instead, waits until they are actually performing a trick is choosing to be lucky instead of good or even great.

It's important to note that practice and rehearsal aren't linear stages; they often overlap. A magician may go back to practicing a specific technique when, during rehearsal, they recognize that a technical aspect of a trick must be changed.

The title of this essay is "Practicing vs Rehearsing", but that's a bit misleading. It should be "Practicing and Rehearsing" because without incorporating both practice and rehearsal into the development of a trick, that magician's performance will be less compelling, less engaging, less fooling, less entertaining – less magical.


