May Meeting Round-up

May 19th was the exciting date for the annual Ring 96 close-up competition. We decided not to hold our usual pre-meeting workshop so as not to teach magic to our lay guest audience. Instead, we jumped right into the competition.

The event was emceed by Kevin Papke who had won the competition last year. Kevin had taken the names of the performers and randomized them so there was neither advantage nor bias in the order of appearance.

The first performer of the night was our current President John Piercy. John began his set with his version of "Cards Across." His volunteer counted out cards and found them moving as if by magic. Next John brought out a pile of postcards. Each card had the name of a well-known movie on it. He turned his back

while she pulled out one card and shuffled the rest. John took a glance through the remaining pile; he easily named the movie she selected.

Jon Strum was the next performer. He took a deck of cards and began to deal them out. He instructed someone to yell stop at the right moment and he did. He started a new pile and had another person call "stop." He did this four times and revealed that the top card of each pile was an Ace. Jon performed his version of twisting the aces. The different aces took turns being right side up and upside down. Next came a version of MacDonald Aces which certainly left the volunteer with her jaw on the floor.

Paul Case was next. He did a clever bit with the audience holding up one hand open and one in a fist. They were instructed to switch their hands status to various questions, and this ended with everyone's right hand open.

Paul showed off a photo of his pride and joy, which is a fine old sight gag. Paul had a random card selected and placed back in the deck. Paul named the correct card and showed it was on the underside of the card box all the time.

Allan Hanson opened with David Regal's "Sudden Deck." Much to the amusement of the audience. It looked like was about to go into the cups and balls, but instead, he produced a sock puppet in a sight gag. Then came the cups and balls which led to a sponge ball routine.

Larry "Zeezo" Campbell opened by having a volunteer sign a dollar bill. Larry took the pen and stabbed it through the bill. Somehow the bill was soon shown to be unharmed. He changes a \$1 bill to a \$10 bill. He changed the \$10 to \$100 in his volunteer's hand. Larry changed a \$1 bill to four quarters in the volunteer's hand. The reality was that it was a mis-made bill it changed into, but that is four quarters. Pulling out a stack of \$5 bills, Larry showed both sides. One flip over and they were all \$100 bills. Larry ended with a pair of sucker gags using two coins, and one that kept reappearing no matter how often it was taken out of his hand.

While the votes were being counted, Kevin Papke the emcee came out and did a few tricks. His version of Kate and Edith had the audience rolling.

When the dust settled, Larry Campbell had won first place, Allan Hanson had taken second and Jon Strum had taken third. Larry also won the "people's choice" award as selected by the guests rather than the members.

- 6. Just 1 effect please.




























Houdini's grave is in trouble

There is an alarming situation unfolding at the Houdini gravesite. A crack in the exedra, which appeared a few years ago, is expanding. A large chunk has recently fallen off the back. The danger of cracks like this is water can get inside and freeze during winter, causing the cracks to enlarge. There is a very real danger that if left untreated, a large section of the exedra will break off. The photos below were taken by our friend Perry Reed a few weeks ago and should chill us all.

The good news is Dorothy Dietrich, owner of the Houdini Museum in Scranton, is now Chairman of the S.A.M. Houdini Gravesite Committee and is well aware of the situation. Dorothy, along with Dick Brookz, famously restored the Houdini bust and the headstones of Gladys and Leopold, so she has been a loving and proactive caretaker of Houdini's grave. Dorothy is working with the co-chairman Joe Devlin on a solution.

Cracks like these can be repaired, and the S.A.M. does have a Houdini Gravesite Fund they can draw from to help. But, as Dorothy points out, the repairs need to be done during the dry summer months so that means now. Another winter will increase the danger of the exedra breaking, and fixing that might not be so easy.

You can help by making a contribution to the <u>Houdini Gravesite Fund</u>. Or you can contact Dorothy Dietrich directly at the <u>Houdini</u> <u>Museum</u>. Houdini always looked after the graves of fellow magicians, so it's time to do the same for him.

Silent Auction


