## August Meeting Round-up

On Saturday August 20<sup>th</sup> Ring 96 held our annual close-up competition. We had 51 guests come to watch us perform. This meant we had a strong audience and an excited crowd. The audience included special guest star Ken Sands, the owner and proprietor of the brick-and-mortar magic shop "Magic Galore and More," in Westminster California.

Up first was Larry "Zeezo"
Campbell. Larry is known for his money magic and he did not disappoint. He opened his set with a color changing knife routine. Now out came his wallet. He changed a \$1 bill into a \$10 bill. He changed a \$10 bill into a \$100 bill. Then he took a \$1 bill and

folded it up placing into a volunteer's hand. He asked her what value of bill she wanted it changed into, she asked for a \$100 bill. That was what was in her hand. Another \$1 was placed into her hand and Larry bet her he could change it into four quarters. Well out came a mis made \$1 bill that certainly was in quarters. The volunteer signed a \$1 bill, Larry rolled it up and stuck it into a small sized zig-zag box. The bill was clearly taken into three pieces, and vet, it was whole when removed. Larry ended with two coins on the table. He put a glass over them and shook them up. One coin vanished.

Dan Habel was second on the list. He brought out two jumbo cards and showed both sides as ordinary. When he rubbed them together a jumbo \$100 bill appeared between them. Next, he had a volunteer

count out a random number of cards. He counted out a few more. When he got to the number of cards, she had picked that became the chosen card. After spelling out the name of the card using magnetic cards against a board, the chosen card was found.

George Reis arrived to the stage and immediately produced a silver dollar from thin air. Soon one silver dollar became two, and then again back to one. This one also vanished. George pulled out a packet of four cards. They were all blank. One was flipped over to show it now had a blue back. Soon they all had blue backs. Once was flipped over to reveal it to be the Queen of Diamonds. Now they were all Queen of diamonds. One was flipped over and shown to have a red back. Soon all four were red backed. . They ended as four jokers with different colored backs.

George ended by having a young volunteer put a wooden coffee stirrer stick into a Starbucks bag. The bag was rolled up and the stick was audibly heard to be broken in several places as George snapped the bag. When the bag was unrolled and opened, the stick was restored to one piece.

Phil Ureno introduced himself as "The Traveler;" a man who travels both the world and through time. He wore a steampunk style top hat and a leather vest. Phil brough out a tiki looking chalice that opened up to reveal several items. A gem, two bones of different colors and a pair of small wands. The volunteer was given the gem and told to place it in front of one of the bones. The Chalice lit up to show he had made the correct choice. The effect ended with the volunteer getting to keep a souvenir "coin." A second volunteer was brought up and she was shown a series of flash cards and told to remember one. She was handed a pack of scented markers and told to choose a scent. Phil revealed the flash card had a picture of a cup of coffee and the scent matched as well.

David Fisher was next. He showed us a blue packet and a red packet. When the volunteer picked "blue," he set the red packet aside. The cards presented to be characters who might see in a circus. The volunteer shuffled the deck, and flipped over the top card. It was a "magician," and the card proclaimed, "You will pick the blue deck." Even though the volunteer had shuffled the deck, the blue cards were in the same order as the red ones. Then David had the volunteer pick one card from the blue deck. David correctly guessed it to be the "Ring Master."

Marty Gorman was out next performer. He had a volunteer pick a card, and replace it in the deck. After a bit of shuffling, Marty predicted it would be the second card down in the deck... it was! Marty tossed small packets of the deck down on the table and asked for a number. The number "7" was chosen. He counted seven cards down and there was the chosen card. A new card was chosen. Marty looked at packets of cards before naming the chosen card.

Dan Sherer produced a liberty half dollar. Then a Japanese coin with a hole in it, and an English half penny. He placed all three coins in a purse, shook it a bit and the lower value coins had changed into the higher value coins. Next Dan showed us a small leather cup, a small bag, and a die. He put the die in the cup and shook it. We could all hear it. He played a game of where is the die? In his hand, in his pocket, or in the cup? No one could get it right. He passed the die straight through the cup, and later the bag appeared in the cup. For a surprise ending, there was suddenly a lemon under the cup.

Michael Van Horn arrived on the stage dressed as a classic old-time gambler. He played a classic game of "find the ace" (3 card monte) He told the story of meeting a gambler who let him win the first time and then took all his money by fast card manipulation. Finally, the gambler sold him the three cards for \$20. When he tried it himself, the victim took Michael's money as well. Michael was not done yet.

He brough tout three walnut shells and a pea for the shell game. He showed us various demos of how the shell game can fool someone and never really gave away anything, but at the end there were peas under every shell.

Roger Manderscheid the time traveler was next. He brought out three decks of cards, and had a volunteer pick one. This deck was dealt into piled to eliminate cards. When there was one card left, that was the chosen card. The second volunteer also picked a deck and was told to count out 15 cards. The fifteenth card matched the first chosen card. Roger took the third deck which had not been opened. He rolled six dice and counted a number to pick which card to take. It matched.

Dan Hurtt vanished a silver dollar. It reappeared. He put in in his pocket and it passed right through the material of his pants, then it transformed into a different coin. Dan pulled out a deck of cards and asked a volunteer to cut into four piles. The four aces were the top cards. He picked a volunteer by tossing a full-sized football into the audience. Dan had several cards picked and had the values of the cards added up. They made 57. The football was labeled from Super Bowl 57. His wallet had 57 dollars in it. A bottle of Heinze 57 Ketchup appeared on the table from nowhere.

Jon Strum did a three-card monte demonstration using jokers and an ace for the money card. First the three cards all became iokers. He did that again. He brought out a packet of Jokers. These hanged into two aces. Two jokers and one ace somehow became four jokers. Two jokers and one ace became three jokers in a volunteer's hand. He ended by showing the backs of a deck were all different colors.

The votes were cast and tabulated.

Larry "Zeezo" Campbell took third place.

Michael Van Horn came in second

Jon Strum got top honors for first place.


Lecture by Jheff
