November Meeting Round-up

Ring 96 Met on Saturday November 19th for their annual Stage Competition. This exciting event is open to the public and is publicized well in the local community. The members of the community area invited to vote on the people's choice award, while the magician of the Ring vote on the trophies for first, second and third place.

President Paul Case, last year's winner was the emcee for this year's event. In accordance with our rules, the emcee does not give any background, history or information about the performers. The emcee simply introduces the performers by name. This is done intentionally to avoid biasing the voters in any way.

The first performer was John Piercy who came out dressed as a swami and declared himself to be "Can-Do the Seer." John had three bags on his table of three different colors. He brought two young people up to the stage and asked each to name one of the three colors. When he opened the named bag, there was a cup of soda waiting for them as a prize. When he opened the remaining bag, it contained a \$20 bill.

Brad Erickson came to the stage and showed a hollow vase that was open on both the top and bottom. He played with the audience while putting silks into the vase in all the colors of the rainbow. Brad sang a supportive song to the vase.

Next he performed the classic linking rings routine, including a volunteer who could not separate her rings, but managed to catch up to magician every time much to the amusement of the audience.

Last was a cups and balls routine that was a real crowd pleaser.

Jim Greene performed a ring on the rope routine where the number of rings used increased as he went on, and the complexity increased as well.

While the ballots were counted, new member Vinnie "The Godfather" Marini entertained the audience with some card effects.

The ballots were counted and Michael Van Horn picked up first place as well as the people's choice award. Phil Ureno came in second and Jim Greene was in third place.
