May Meeting Round-up

On May 18th Ring 96 held its annual Close-up magic competition. The room was filled with over 20 members and over 40 guests. This made for a high energy event.

Our host, Paul LaGreek introduced the rules by explaining to the performers and guests that each magician would have ten minutes to perform. The room was split into two sections separated by partitions. Each magician would perform twice, once for each side of the room. This allowed an audience of about 60 people to still see a

close-up show from a close-up distance.

Phillip Ureno opened the show. Phillip is a time traveler who uses Chinese props and methodology to travel in backward and forward in time and perform magic. He performed Chinese halves to do a coin to pocket routine. Phil used a pack of flower seeds and a flower backed deck, a spectator somehow managed to find the only two cards in the deck that matched, both in value and in the roses on the back of the cards. He followed that up with a series of colored chips which represents different planets. A spectator chose one and the chosen one was listed on the back as the one that would be picked.

Bill Pearce opened with a quick demo of changing a 1 dollar bill to a one hundred. This is everyone's dream, isn't it? Bill did an entertaining version of "Fast and Loose" where a folded up chain is laid out and cannot be pinned in place. Bill used the fast and loose chain to do a ring off the chain routine, and finally dealt two poker hands to two spectators. One spectator got to choose which cards to use and had a full house. The other spectator not only got dealt a royal flush, but the hand matched the necktie Bill was wearing.

David Fisher started off by borrowing a spectators ring. He threaded a string through it, and proceeded to put the ring on and off the string.

Campbell performed some stage magic that included a comedy linking ring routine.

At the end of the evening the members voted the winners. Third Place was David Fisher, Second Place was Bill Pearce, and in First Place, Phillip Ureno.

The guest audience voted for "The people's choice award," to Phillip Ureno as well.




