According to Larry, a business card can be casually thrown away. A balloon animal, while pleasant to look out will only last a few days. He told us that people who have watched you make the pearl necklace dog will keep them for years. Larry starts with a string of 17 pearls and twists them into a dog in a process so easy that anyone can do it. Larry also had very simple homemade measuring devices as well as lots of necklaces available.

The workshop concluded with Kevin Papke showing us how to make paper flowers out of a single ply of a cocktail napkin. This is a wonderful "souvenir" to give out to people or to make out of flash paper for an onstage effect.

Will you be there next month?


