August Meeting Round-up

On August 17, Tony Clark came to Ring 96 to give his new lecture. Tony is known far and wide for his magical skill, versatility and the fact that he trained under the late great Slydini. This is a fact that Tony uses to his advantage as he moves and performs moves. Several times during the lecture he stopped the action to show us the choices in motion in which Slydini's influence was evident.

Tony opened with a multiple silk production from his previously empty and open hands. When he demonstrated how to

prepare, load, hide and produce the silks, it proved to be a simple set up that pretty much anyone with some magic skills could perform. He said you could produce up to six silks in this manner, though he only demonstrated four.

Tony showed us his version of the six-card repeat. When Tony performs this, it includes storytelling, the effect itself and card-throwing. The fact that Tony throws all the spent cards into the audience proves that there is no gimmick involved. When he showed us how to perform the effect, again it was one that anyone with a bit of practice could pull off, with no gimmick to speak of. Probably the best kind of magic is one where the magician ends clean.

Next Tony showed us his three phase cut and restored rope routine. The third phase featured a traveling knot and again Tony ended clean and ready for whatever was next.

Flying Knots was Tony's next effect. He came out with two wine flutes and each had two white silks in them. He pulled them out one at a time and showed they were simply four standard handkerchiefs. Tony tied two silks together and put them back in the wine flute. He then pantomimed the knot flying from one flute to the other. Sure enough the two tied together were free and the other two that had been free were now knotted together. Tony recommends plastic wine flutes from the dollar store. They are cheap and

not so easy to break.

Match Impossible is an effect in which a magician has wooden matches from a box pass through his hand and into the spectators waiting hand. The set up here is simple and can be made by anyone with some time on their hands.

At this point in the lecture someone made a joke. Tony went into his briefcase and asked for the joke to be repeated. When it was he pressed a button on his phone and a snare drum "rim shot" was played. The phone app "Go Button" is free and gives you a variety of sound effects that you can use; many more if you upgrade and pay for it.

Tony demonstrated his famous knife through jacket. This is a routine Tony has been doing for years and he is truly an expert. The membership all liked it and some might even perform it themselves.

His version of a rising card is simple to do and a real crowd pleaser.

Tony's last bit was the psychic snake. Here a flat rectangular piece of metal that is decorated to look like a snake jumps onto the volunteer's wrist in the presence of the chosen card. It is quite a shock and often the snake will pin the card to their wrist.

Someone asked a question about routining and how to set up a block of magic that will work for an audience.

Tony's reply was to make sure to use an erratic tempo. Just as you don't want to speak in a monotone, you don't want your magic to do that either. Change it up. Follow a fast trick with a slower one. Follow a long trick with a short one. Follow up a comedy piece with a dramatic one etc. Bring in



music when appropriate and keep variety in vour set.


