First up was Cliff Gerstman who used a document reader hooked up to the computer in order to add a "Close up



table" to the zoom screen. Cliff Introduced 12 cards, all the royalty, and stacked them up by name. 4 jacks, 4 queens and 4 kings. He switched the top cards around, effectively scrambling the piles, but the jacks somehow still stayed with the jacks, and the queens stayed with the queens. The Jack was found in Marty's pocket.

The Jack, on top of the

deck gets cut into the middle. The jack is suddenly right side up.

The Jack goes into the middle of the deck, and rises to the top.



Marcia Harris did a series of sight gags. She had a diamond necklace made out of thirteen cards; the diamonds. She showed us an antique Bicycle deck from 1800's. Had a potato with a face drawn on it. Turing the potato upside down, and the happy face becomes a sad face. She had a "no" button that said "NO!" when you pressed it.


