# **May 2024**



On Saturday, April 20th Ring 96 met for our latest meeting.

The meeting opened with our pre-meeting workshop. Vinny, the Godfather of magic showed us some moves and effects including cards across and his personal "scoop" move.

The official meeting soon opened with Magic Castle performer and former board member Paul Green as our guest speaker.

Paul began his lecture by demonstrating and teaching his handling of the timehonored classic "The Professor's Nightmare." Two things to be noted... Paul used Green ropes for the effect, and his

handling was different than the version most people know and use. Many members found it smoother and more magical.


Next, Paul showed us his version of a six-coin "Coins Across." He spoke in detail about the right way to palm a coin and the right size coin for your hand. As usual, his handling was excellent and he took the time to Nake sure everyone understood the mechanism. He also pointed us to his video online if we wanted more in-depth details.

Paul brought out a square piece of paper with a 16 square grid on it and "X's" and "O's" in an alternating pattern. He folded the paper up tightly and asked a volunteer to choose the X's or O's. X's were chosen, and Paul made one cut clean through the folded page. The O's were pulled out one at a time and the X's remained attached.

Paul followed up with a clever card trick that starts with a prediction and uses two volunteers to pass cards to each other. After several passes, the prediction proves to be a series of predictions about the deck and all are correct.

For part two, Paul lead a session of critiquing members' effects. He began with a strong explanation of how to critique. He promised not to pull punches, but to be constructive. The specific goal is to help members improve their magic.

President John Piercy went first. He had a card selected. The card went into a bag and out came a banner with the card's likeness on it.

George Reis showed us a multi-phase "Ringon-a-rope" routine.

David told a story about his mom teaching him to star-gaze as he performed "Starcle."

Kevin Papke showed us a single coin routine that kept everyone guessing!

Jon Strum finished the night with a strong card trick that involved a volunteer. The volunteer was allowed to shuffle the deck and parts of the deck several times. When all was done, impossible as it seemed when the volunteer spelled "Impossible" by dealing out cards, the chosen card was at the end of the word.

Paul Green delivered a wonderful lecture and critique workshop.

Invading San Diego's Ring 76

On April 8, five members of our Ring made a field trip to Old Town San Diego to attend the Ring 76 meeting. I learned from Cliff Gerstman



that they are a thriving club with over 70 members and an average of 50 to 60 attendees at each meeting.

Their theme was "Fool Us." They give out a very cool looking certificate to anyone who fools the judges. The sample they showed us is also in a beautiful frame (not the 99 cent document frame from Michaels). A beautiful presentation that I know I'd be



proud to have on my wall.

One member stands at the signin desk where he signs in members

and guests. He also shows everyone the door prize/ raffle items and sells tickets; he also sells tickets for their 50/50 drawing (winner gets half the ticket sales, the other half goes to their library fund - I won last night!). They have a donation can for a member in need. And, this desk also has a bunch of their club brochures (very nicely done). Prizes were pretty good. One is a mystery - the one last night had 24 packet tricks in it. Everyone gets one free ticket.

I thought this set-up was great. It might be more efficient to have a longer table with two people staffing it. It seemed like it could be too much for one person, and there could be a long wait for people to check-in with their current method.



They also had a "Ring Store" set-up in the room. When we attended this was filled with low priced items (many for \$1) and included decks of cards, packet tricks, and thumb tips. There were also some parlor tricks – John Piercy was eyeing a gospel themed parlor effect, and I saw an interesting dye box that was a small cardboard popcorn carton.



Their meeting room is nice with a stage (that wasn't used for some reason). The seating arrangement was nice with a center aisle that

widened toward the front (or narrowed toward the back), making a great view for the inside seats even though they didn't use the stage (still don't know why they didn't). They had a new video set-up that they used for two performances - an iPhone mounted to a boom stand with an HDMI to a large monitor to provide an overhead view. It looked great!

Kevin Papke scoped out the sound systems that they

used and has some ideas for our ring. Three performers brought their own system. One seemed to provide the best sound. All three of these



performers shared information with him about what they were using, what they liked about each, etc.

Before the meeting started a few people came up to us at various times, and we engaged a few people for short conversations. I don't have enough experience to say this wasn't much different than other magic clubs - but I think that would be a fair statement. I will say that it didn't feel "cliquish" at all – and I believe all five of us felt very welcomed by each person we encountered.

The drawings were at the beginning of the meeting with the announcements. I liked it, as it got it out of the way. I didn't like it because it seemed like it took too much time (the time for raffles always kind of bothers me at magic club meetings). That time,

however, enabled late comers to join without missing any of the meeting/lecture/event, and provided time for performers to get prepared, tech crew to



double check stuff, etc. As long as door prizes or raffles are a part of meetings – I think approaching it at the start of the meeting is a better way to handle them.

One announcement was to make sure everyone signed-in, which I think it a good idea.

They also announced the upcoming elections and the fact that nominations are open in a fair manner. I think nominations and elections can become a bit



awkward – they don't have to be, and I think the invitation to run for the available positions was well done.

They have a monthly on-line board meeting, and their current president (Josh) swears that he starts exactly on time and finishes in exactly one hour or less. Nice. Monthly board meeting. Time limit. I'd like to see a sample of their agenda. I'd like to attend one of their board meetings. Two people "auditioned" for their club membership (One as her performance during their "Fool Us" show, one before the show started). They require an applicant to perform, then the membership votes (everyone passes). They don't do the series of three readings. They do require membership in the international body. I liked the idea of requiring a performance. In a discussion with Kevin, he said for really new people to magic, this could be an opportunity to develop a mentorship program. Someone wants to join – they aren't comfortable performing anything, so we provide a mentor to help

them work on something.

The main show went quite well. Things moved quickly enough, performances were all good - some quite impressive. Judging was



fairly quick. The average caliber was high – you could tell that each performer put time into developing their routine. Each one performed with confidence and entertained the audience. There were nine performers, and the meeting ended just before 9:00.

In the after-meeting, over 20 people went to Denny's. People were at five tables. Conversations seemed animated at all tables (and I wish I could have been with other Ring 76 members). Kevin took advantage of visiting another table to get to know members and find out what draws them to Ring 76. I wish I had done that also. I did hear from one person that he really likes belonging to Ring 76 because it is truly a 'brotherhood.'

It was a great field-trip to a thriving Ring. The meeting was fun, professional, had energy, and the time flew-by. Hopefully we can bring some of what we learned to Ring 96.

Vinny went over his scoop move which is very unique to him. He uses it to make up for having smaller hands and needing to develop alternative methods to do his sleights.


We had ten members come to the workshop which was considered a big success.
